



President's Report

The ASMR's activities over the past year have been driven by the development of a bid to ensure long term growth in the funding for Australian health R&D. This has underpinned our well-recognized public, political and scientific advocacy work.

- The year began with the inaugural **Australian Health and Medical Research Congress** in Melbourne. The Congress was an ASMR initiative and was a resounding success, bringing together 25 professional societies, over 2000 registrants, over 60 trade booths and an unparalleled scientific program. Planning for the second Congress (Sydney 2004) is now well underway and I would encourage you all to get involved.
- The second set of **Australian Case Studies** was released in May. These five profiles highlighted the long term health outcomes of some well known Australian research including Professor Terry Dwyer and his team's work to identify a link between sleeping position and SIDS. These profiles have certainly raised awareness of the outstanding contributions by Australian researchers among our political leaders.
- Our flagship activity **ASMR Medical Research Week^(R)** was a resounding success this year featuring activities across the country, including Scientific Meetings, Careers Events, Medical Research Expos, Public Lectures, a national PR campaign and the ASMR Medalist Tour by Professor Terry Dwyer, involving gala dinners in 5 states and the televised address at the National Press Club. The inaugural Exceptional Returns Forum brought together key stakeholders in Australian health R&D to develop a strategy for the long term future of this vital enterprise.

- You will all be aware of the recently released groundbreaking report, **"Exceptional Returns: the Value of Investing in Health R&D in Australia"** prepared by Access Economics for ASMR. This independent analysis showed that every dollar invested in Australian health R&D returns up to \$5 in national economic benefit as a consequence of improved lifespan and quality of life. The report highlighted the decline in public sector funding of Australian health R&D and how we lag well behind other OECD countries in this regard. The Exceptional Returns Report is the first independent study which shows that investment in health R&D is an investment in wellness with exceptional returns.
- The ASMR **Grass Roots Campaign** to *"Build an Investment in Our Future"* is now well underway. The campaign calls on the Federal Government to show leadership by committing to an additional \$1 billion support for Australian health R&D to be phased in over 5 years beyond 2004/05. We have also called on all health and medical researchers to communicate the health outcomes of their own research to their local MP and the disastrous effects of not investing long term.

The campaign webpage had over 1500 hits in its first week showing the tremendous commitment of researchers to the future of this industry. We await the outcome of the funding bid and have completed a pre-budget submission for the 2004 budget.

President's Report (continued)

- An **Investment Review of Health and Medical Research** has been announced recently. This review will look at the impact of the doubling of the NHMRC budget which began in 1999 and advise on future options. I have received a formal invitation to be a member of the review panel; it is encouraging that ASMR has been given the opportunity to provide input at this level.
- We are looking forward to this years **National Scientific Conference**, to be held in conjunction with the Hanson Symposium and a one day symposium on "*Organisation and Control of Human Movement*". The NHMRC will also celebrate the 150th session of council with a symposium and lunch on the last day of the meeting. The Board of Directors is currently exploring conducting the 2005 National Scientific Conference as part of ComBio. This is designed to offer members access to a broader range of scientific sessions and to maximise registrations and trade participation.

As our population ages, the impact of premature death, pain, suffering and disability from disease and injury will only increase. There are still many unanswered questions and health R & D is the only hope to provide these answers. We can all be very proud of what Australia has generated in health R & D outcomes to date, with comparatively low resources. However, for the 21st century to be the "*century of healing*" all sectors involved in this vital enterprise must collaborate, cooperate and communicate.

ASMR is taking the lead in driving this agenda. We must maintain the momentum.

In closing, I would like to thank a number of people whose efforts have been critical to the Society's work this year and who, on a personal note, have provided me with much appreciated support in a busy and challenging

year! Thank you to all the members of local committees for your hard work, enthusiasm and innovative ideas, thank you to Mike Pickford, Maree Overall and the team at ASN Events for your first class event management, thanks also to Anne Hayward for your strategic PR work. Thank you to Professor Andrew Tonkin and Dr Lyn Roberts at the Heart Foundation, who have provided me with outstanding support in a very busy year. Thanks also to my wonderful and very supportive team at the Foundation - Holly and Kylie. A special thank you to Cath West and Lexy Harris in the Executive Office, who continue to be the backbone of the society working quietly behind the scenes to support an ever increasing array of activities. I would like to sincerely thank all the ASMR Directors and in particular the Executive. It has been my privilege to work with these very talented and committed individuals, who have worked so well together as a team. I have particularly enjoyed working with Andrew Sinclair (President-Elect) and I know the Society will be in good hands under his leadership. A final thankyou to outgoing directors, Anthony Armson and Ricky Johnstone, for your important contributions to the Society and my best wishes to newly-elected directors, Lisa Butler, Moira O'Bryan, Jacqueline Phillips and the entire Board for what will no doubt be a busy year to come!

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE AUSTRALIAN SOCIETY FOR MEDICAL RESEARCH, HELD AT THE MELBOURNE EXHIBITION AND CONFERENCE CENTRE, ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 29TH 2002.

Item 1 - Welcome and Apologies - Prof Peter Schofield

In the presence of the required quorum, Prof. Schofield opened the Meeting announcing Apologies from Dr Kieran Scott, Dr Stella Clark, Dr Margaret Morris, Associate Professor Judy Black, Professor Carol Armour and Mrs Ruth Lillian.

Item 2 - Confirmation of the Minutes, AGM of 27th November 2001 - Prof Peter Schofield

Professor Schofield called for confirmation of the minutes. Associate Professor Andrew Sinclair moved that the Minutes be accepted as a true and accurate reflection of the AGM of 27th November 2001; seconded by Dr Peter O'Loughlin.

Item 3 - President's Report - Prof Peter Schofield

Professor Schofield advised the Meeting that it was five years ago in 1998, that the Board of ASMR, during the Presidency of Professor Steve Wesselingh, took the decision to initiate organization of a "Congress" type meeting by beginning consultations with other societies. The culmination of those discussions is the inaugural Australian Health and Medical Research Congress. Professor Schofield said he was privileged to be the President of the Society at the time of the first Congress. He thanked Dr Bronwyn Kingwell, the Congress Organising Committee and Program and Management Sub-Committees, Australian Science Network Pty Ltd, particularly Mike Pickford and Maree Overall, the twenty-five participating societies and all of the individuals who

contributed to the outstanding success of the first Australian Health and Medical Research Congress. Professor Schofield also thanked Anne Hayward from Investor Relations Strategies for her contribution in obtaining publicity for the event. The next Australian Health and Medical Research Congress is to be held in 2004.

ASMR Medical Research Week (is the premier public advocacy event for the Society and it continues to develop and expand. Our thanks to Professor Leon Rosenberg, the ASMR Medallist in 2002, our national sponsors the Department of Health and Ageing, AMRAD, Merck Sharp & Dohme and many state-based sponsors, critical to the success of the week. Over the years ASMR has achieved good media coverage and this year in particular with Anne Hayward from Investor Relations Strategies. Planning for 2003 is well underway.

On the political front, ASMR has had meetings with key politicians and many parliamentarians. Most recently, all politicians received from ASMR the first of a series of 'Australian Case Studies' highlighting the value of health and medical research. We have provided input and submissions on a broad range of issues including project specific infrastructure, access to Federation Fellowships, the stem cell debate and the Gene Technology Act. Over the year the Society has developed closer working

relationships with the Federation of Australian Scientific and Technological Societies (FASTS), Research Australia, and the Australian Association of Australian Medical Research Institutes (AAMRI)

Outcomes of the National Research Priorities exercise are to be announced soon. ASMR has nominated health as a National Research Priority. The Wills Review made a compelling argument for an increased investment in health and medical research on the basis that the returns would justify the investment and future investment. Collection of performance indicators is a key activity which ASMR has been closely involved with and the release of the first five 'Australian Case Studies' is supporting the case for continued and additional funding. The second five 'Australian Case Studies' are being developed. Professor Schofield urged members to provide ideas and suggestions for additional studies.

The Minister for Health and Ageing, Senator Kay Patterson recently announced recipients of New Project Grants. Professor Schofield congratulated the Minister on the timely approval of Project Grants and advised that the process can be further shortened by the office of NHMRC streamlining the preparation of final approval documents.

Professor Schofield thanked his fellow directors and executive directors for their

work in advancing public, political and scientific advocacy for medical research. He thanked retiring Directors, Dr Cathie Coulter and Dr Giuseppe Simonetta, Dr Bronwyn Kingwell for her work as Congress Convenor, Dr Ricky Johnstone as NSC Convenor, he welcomed newly elected directors, Dr Chris Semsarian and Dr Maria Kavallaris. Professor Schofield wished Dr Moira Clay the incoming President of ASMR and her team every success for the coming year and concluded his report by thanking all of the members for their support of health and medical research.

Item 4 - Treasurer's Report - Dr Rohan Baker

Dr Baker referred to the published financial statements and advised that the Society had achieved an operating profit of \$50,098 for the year and showed assets of \$377,924. Dr Baker reported that the financial position of the ASMR is sound. He thanked Australian Science Network Pty Ltd for their contribution to the successful management of various events. Dr Baker moved that the Financial Reports contained within the Annual Report be accepted; seconded by Dr Peter O'Loughlin; carried unanimously by the Meeting.

Item 5 - Research Fund - Dr Rohan Baker

Dr Baker referred again to the Financial Reports contained within the Annual Report, advising that the Research Fund had a small loss of \$271.00 on the year. He further reported that it is intended to continue the annual Research Award of

\$5000. The Research Fund shows assets of \$33,284. Dr Baker moved that the Financial Reports contained within the Annual Report be accepted; seconded by Dr Peter O'loughlin; carried unanimously by the Meeting.

Item 6 - Subcommittee Reports

a) Research Careers - Dr Anthony Armson

Dr Armson reported that Dr Cathie Coulter has prepared some assistance for anyone applying for a research grant, preparing a CV, etc. These documents will be circulated and made available on the ASMR website. It is planned to conduct a survey to assess how people feel about different aspects of their careers. This will in fact be a 'brain gain' survey to complement the previous ASMR 'brain drain' survey. Dr Armson urged members to find the time to complete the survey and where possible to pass a copy to colleagues to complete.

b) Membership - Dr Ricky Johnstone

Dr Johnstone reported that there are currently 947 financial members of the Society and that the Membership Committee has set the goal of doubling membership. Dr Johnstone advised that the strategy will be to request that each member recruits one new member. ASMR, Dr Johnstone said, represents 113000 Australians through direct membership, affiliate and associate memberships. He urged all present to encourage colleagues to join the Society. Professor Peter Schofield announced a point of membership and Dr Moira Clay addressed the Meeting.

Dr Clay advised the meeting that it was her privilege to

propose that Ms Catherine West, ASMR's Senior Executive Officer, be elected a Life Member of the Society. Dr Clay advised that Cath West has been with the Society since 1994 and has developed a highly efficient and effective head office. Up until recent years, Cath alone was head office, responsible for all aspects of management of the Society up to and including IT, PR, tactical advice and at times counselling of directors. Now with support from Lexy Harris, Cath continues to add immense extra value to the Society including this week, working behind the scenes generating strong press interest in the Congress. She has been key to serving the ASMR membership through the Newsletter, Website and our advocacy and awareness raising activities. Her sense of history of the Society is second to none, introducing me, Dr Clay said, to Mr David Price who wrote the Articles of Association some forty years ago and continues to act as ASMR's legal adviser, a man passionately supportive of our work. Cath's work behind the scenes in maintaining existing and developing new relationships is immensely valuable to the Society. Her corporate memory is vital to the Board of Directors and has allowed the ASMR to build on its credibility and focus successfully on goals. One key contribution of Cath's, which many will be unaware of, is the formation of our network of affiliations of societies, medical colleges and foundations groups. We now have over forty of these affiliations and through them represent over 100,000 people. An example of the success of these affiliations is the Congress itself. Cath's wisdom and common sense

has shone through over the years and her sense of humour makes her fun to work with. Having worked with Cath closely over a number of years, I have the utmost respect for her as a person, her values, passion and commitment to ASMR. On behalf of the Board of Directors and four immediate Past Presidents, Professor Steve Wesselingh, Associate Professor Matthew Gillespie, Dr Robert Ramsay, Dr Peter O'Loughlin, Dr Moira Clay proposed that Ms Catherine West be elected a Life Member of The Australian Society for Medical Research in honour of her outstanding contribution to the promotion of Health and Medical Research and the ASMR. Dr Clay requested show of hands. The Nomination to Life Membership for Ms Catherine West was carried unanimously.

Dr Clay presented a gift from the Society and asked Ms West to address the Meeting. Cath West thanked the Society for the Honour of Life Membership and expressed her pleasure in the association with ASMR and her desire to continue to serve the Society in pursuing its goals on behalf of health and medical research and health and medical researchers.

Professor Peter Schofield thanked Lexy Harris for her assistance in communication with the membership on the Nomination to Life Membership.

c) Newsletter - Associate Prof Andrew Sinclair

Associate Professor Sinclair thanked Dr Alaina Ammit and Cath West for their work on

the Newsletter. There were three editions of the ASMR Newsletter this year. The publication is evolving and currently focussing more on feature articles. Associate Professor Sinclair requested members input on articles to be included in 2003.

d) ASMR Medical Research Week - Dr Moira Clay

Dr Clay advised that ASMR Medical Research Week(was a resounding success and thanked all participants for their contributions. It is a national event, she said, with strong media coverage. Dr Clay thanked Anne Hayward (Investor Relations Strategies) and Cath West. Media Monitoring indicates that 2.8M Australians were reached during the week.

e) State Reports - Prof Peter Schofield

Prof Schofield acknowledged the work of the State Committees and Convenors organising and implementing the various ASMR Medical Research Week(events and expressed the thanks and gratitude of the Board and Members.

f) Australian Health and Medical Research Congress Dr Bronwyn Kingwell

Dr Kingwell advised the Meeting that the Congress has worked well with 2000 registrants and a strong scientific content. Trade exhibitors are pleased with the outcome. Dr Kingwell thanked her committees and in particular Dr Wayne Phillips and the team from Australian Science Network Pty Ltd.

g) National Scientific Conference 2002 - Dr Ricky Johnstone

Dr Johnstone thanked all participants his committees, chairs and judges.

h) National Scientific Conference 2003 - Dr Lisa Butler

Dr Lisa Butler advised that Dr Cathie Coulter is convening the NSC 2003 and that planning is well underway. The theme for the Conference is to be "The Life Cycle - From Cells to Systems".

Item 7 - General Business

Professor Schofield asked Members to raise any matters of 'General Business'. Dr Clay responded to a question regarding dates for the NSC 2003 which will be November 22 to 25.

Item 8 - Directors and Office Bearers 2003 - Dr Moira Clay

Dr Clay thanked outgoing Directors, Dr Cathie Coulter and Dr Joe Simonetta for their contributions. Speaking of the outgoing President, Dr Clay advised the Meeting that Peter Schofield has been eloquent in his public, political and scientific advocacy, bringing ASMR activities into very clear focus.

Contributing more submissions to government than any previous president of the Society, Peter Schofield has completed a tremendous amount of work, the outcome of which has increased the credibility for the Society in its advocacy roles. This has been an enormous contribution and benefit to the Society. Dr Clay thanked and congratulated Professor Schofield on behalf of the Board and membership; she then presented the Badge of Past President.

Dr Clay announced that the theme of her presidency would be service to the membership through public, political and scientific advocacy. She spoke of her excitement and enthusiasm for the year ahead with ASMR Medical Research Week(R) going from strength to strength, research careers activities expanding, the NSC

2003 in Adelaide and the second Australian Health and Medical Research Congress already being planned. Politically, Dr Clay advised, key areas will be National Research Priorities, and the NHMRC Performance Review. ASMR has a strong relationship with NHMRC and look forward to working with them. A major activity for the ASMR next year will be setting the scene for this important Performance Review. The Society has produced the first in a series of 'Australian Case Studies' and these will be further developed in the new year. Visits to key politicians will continue; Dr Clay urged members to visit local Members of Parliament to tell personal story on the value of Health and Medical Research. Dr Clay introduced the Board of Directors for 2003 and the Special Liaison Officer Dr Alaina Ammit Medical Research Week Assoc. Prof Mike McGuckin Medical Research Week and Membership Dr Anthony Armson Careers Convenor Dr Ricky Johnstone Membership Convenor Dr Maria Kavallaris Convenor, AHMRC 2004 Dr Christopher Semsarian Clinical Issues Assoc. Prof. Levon Khachigian Business Development Dr Bronwyn Kingwell Hon. Secretary, Public Affairs Dr Rohan Baker Hon. Treasurer Assoc. Prof Andrew Sinclair President-elect, Newsletter Editor-In-Chief


