President's Report

Prof Peter R Schofield

As we undertake this, our 34th Annual General Meeting under the umbrella of the inaugural Australian Health and Medical Research Congress, we have an opportunity to reflect on the performance and achievements of the ASMR over the past year and the future challenges for our sector.

AHMRC 2002

Five years ago the ASMR Board decided to initiate the planning for this Congress. More specifically, the Board asked Dr Bronwyn Kingwell to be Congress Convenor. Little did I realise that I would have the great privilege to be the 2002 ASMR President and to have been able to observe the tireless work of all of the members of the Congress Organising Committee and Program and Management Subcommittees, the enthusiastic partnership with 25 other scientific societies, or the enormous input from Mike Pickford, Maree Overall and the team from Australian Science Network our convention managers. Each and every one of you has been responsible for making this inaugural Congress the outstanding success that you can judge it to be. On behalf of the Board, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all of the individuals who have contributed to this event from the Convenor to the over 1500 registrants.

Based on the success of this Congress in meeting the needs of Australian medical researchers, we have proposed that the second Congress should be held in two years time, in November 2004. This allows an opportunity for individual societies to conduct their individual annual scientific meetings and provides sufficient time for planning the second Congress. I hope the success of this meeting will be the first of many.

ASMR Medical Research Week®

ASMR Medical Research Week® has once again been a major highlight in the calendar of health and medical researchers. The organisation of this, our premier public advocacy activity, continues to develop with the enthusiastic support of local committees across the country. In particular, thanks go to our Medallist, Prof Leon Rosenberg, who

gave a clear and cogent message outlining the exceptional returns that result from investment in health and medical research. National sponsorship from the Department of Health and Ageing, AMRAD, Merck Sharp & Dohme and numerous state-based sponsors have been critical to the success of the week.

Over the years, we have obtained good media coverage from ASMR Medical Research Week®. However, in order to further enhance the capacity of this event to gain media profile, we appointed Anne Hayward of Investor Relations Strategies to manage media communications in 2002. This year we achieved outstanding media coverage of all of our events with over 120 media stories and based on this success will continue to promote health and medical research to the public through ASMR Medical Research Week®.

Planning for 2003 is now well advanced and we will continue to develop the public EXPOs, debates and public lectures, careers days for school students and other events such as pub science.

Political Advocacy

This past year has seen the appointments of a new Minister for Health and Ageing, Senator Kay Patterson, who we thank for so kindly joining us at the Congress dinner, the new Minister for Industry, Science and Training, Hon Dr Brendan Nelson, and the new Minister for Science, Hon Peter McGauran. We have had the opportunity of meeting with each of these Ministers on multiple occasions as well as with other government and opposition members and senators and have maintained a written dialogue with all parliamentarians. Most recently, all members and senators received our newly released series of five case studies highlighting the value of health and medical research to the well being of the Australian community and demonstrating how the investment in health and medical research contributes to the health and wealth of our nation.

We have provided input and submissions on a very broad range of issues including the need for project-specific infrastructure, which we understand will now be addressed through the Higher Education Review. Our representations on Federation Fellowships resulted in the Minister, Hon Dr Brendan Nelson, advising that medical researchers are now eligible to apply for these innovative and highly prestigious awards.

While recognising the diversity of opinions in the controversial area of human embryonic stem cell research, the Board of the ASMR made representations to ensure that a rational and sensible approach to the use of human embryonic stem cells is reached. The Board has supported the governments proposed strong regulatory environment that will provide both scientific and public scrutiny of limited work involving human embryonic stem cells and the use of surplus IVF embryos for stem cell research.

The implementation of the Gene Technology Act is causing some concern in the biomedical research community. In particular, we have stressed the need for appropriate cost recovery structures that recognise the public good nature of the legislation. We are also seeking more logical and consistent procedures based on scientific risk assessment as it appears that contained laboratory dealings with genetically manipulated organisms are being adversely affected by the current system.

Partnerships

Over the year, ASMR has developed closer and more effective working relationships with other advocacy groups including the Association of Australian Medical Research Institutes (AAMRI), the Federation of Australian Scientific and Technological Societies (FASTS), and with Research Australia, who have held their annual general meeting under the umbrella of this Congress. These partnership activities have included developing joint submissions and most recently participating in FASTS Science meets Parliament event two weeks ago.

National Research Priorities

I hope that by the time I present this report that the federal government will have announced the outcomes of the National Research Priorities exercise. Given Australia's clear strengths and leadership in medical research, the ASMR has nominated health as a national priority area; a priority area that can deliver exceptional returns. We anticipate that health will be one of the selected

National Research Priorities and welcome the focus and opportunities that this will provide. The government intends to charge its agencies, such as NHMRC, with developing plans for its research profile to be responsive to the new priorities and we look forward to further contributing to this process.

NHMRC & Performance Indicators

The Wills Review made a compelling argument for an increased investment in health and medical research but did so on the basis that the returns would be quantifiable and would justify the investment and future investments. Collection of the performance indicator data indicated by the Wills Implementation Committee will be critical for evaluation of this increased investment. While initial definition of performance measures has been slow, we are pleased to see that the NHMRC has now responded to this crucial issue with the release of its framework plan. The ASMR, along with other interested parties including AAMRI and Research Australia, have recently met with representatives of the NHMRC to encourage timely collection of this information and have offered to provide whatever assistance possible in documenting the performance indicator measures.

The release of the first of our series of case studies demonstrating the value of investment in health and medical research in leading to improvements in the health, social and economic status of Australians will, we believe, aid in this process. The next five case studies are already under development and will be released in the new year. This is an area in which input and detailed knowledge from our members and affiliate societies will be invaluable. I wish to thank those who have already provided examples and urge you to suggest further examples for case study development.

NHMRC Grant Outcomes

The Minister for Health, Senator Kay Patterson recently announced the successful recipients of New Project Grants and I congratulate all of the successful applicants. Changes in the NHMRC processes now allow individual research grant areas to be awarded separately with the aim of more timely communication of outcomes and I wish to acknowledge publicly the Minister's timely approval of the Project Grants. However, ASMR still believes that this process can be further shortened by the office of NHMRC streamlining the preparation of final approval documents in less than one month.

In closing, I would like to thank my fellow directors and executive directors for their tireless work in the

cause of advancing public, political and scientific advocacy for medical research. It has been a pleasure working with all of you over the past five years. To Dr Cathie Coulter and Dr Joe Simonetta, directors who have completed their terms, I thank you for all of your inputs. To Dr Maria Kavallaris and Dr Chris Semsarian, newly elected directors, welcome. Advocacy for medical research can be a time consuming activity but it is also immensely rewarding. To Dr Bronwyn Kingwell, thank you for all your work as Congress Convenor and I wish you a quieter year ahead. Thanks also to Dr Ricky Johnstone for his work as ASMR NSC Convenor. To the continuing directors, I wish you ongoing success, and I know I leave you in the capable hands of my valued colleague and incoming President, Dr Moira Clay. Finally, but most importantly, I need to thank each of you, the members for ASMR for your tireless work and for your ongoing support of the public, political and scientific advocacy of ASMR.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE AUSTRALIAN SOCIETY FOR MEDICAL RESEARCH HELD AT THE MARRIOTT RESORT HOTEL, GOLD COAST QUEENSLAND, TUESDAY THE 27TH OF NOVEMBER, 2001

Item 1 - Welcome and Apologies

In the presence of the required quorum of members, Dr Peter O'Loughlin opened the Meeting at 1pm, welcoming all present and announcing apologies from Dr Matthew Gillespie, Dr Rob Ramsay and Dr Kieran Scott.

Item 2 - Confirmation of Minutes, AGM of 27th November 2000

Dr Bronwyn Kingwell moved that the Minutes of the AGM of November 27, 2000 be accepted as a true and accurate reflection of that meeting; seconded by Associate Professor Andrew Sinclair.

Item 3 - President's Report - Dr Peter

O'Loughlin

Dr O'Loughlin opened his remarks by thanking the Board of Directors for their hard work throughout the year. He reported that 2001 had been an exceptionally busy year with a major expansion of ASMR MRW® and preparations for the Federal Election. The events of September 11 had the effect of burying HMR issues which had, until that time, been prominent on the political agenda due to the recent reports of the Innovation Summit Implementation Group (ISIG) and of the Chief Scientist, Robin Batterham. ASMR Directors and particularly the Executive Directors met with government and opposition

members throughout the year and in the lead up to the election. In talks with government, the focus was on highlighting the need for rapid implementation of new investments encouraging innovation, incentives for philanthropy, distribution of project-related infrastructure to organizations which incur the costs and an evidence-based approach to regular review of government spending on HMR. The Board has had an excellent working relationship with the outgoing Health Minister, Dr Michael Wooldridge and the Shadow Minister, Jenny Macklin. ASMR will be working towards developing a similar rapport with the incoming Minister for Health and Ageing, Senator Kay Patterson and the Shadow Minister, Stephen Smith.

Dr O'Loughlin thanked those members who responded to calls for letters to government members and candidates. He advised that such campaigns have real value within the political process and were the ammunition which allowed the Minister for Health, in 1998, to successfully call for the Health and Medical Research Strategic Review resulting in the doubling of NHMRC funding.

Referring to ASMR MRW®, Dr O'Loughlin thanked Dr Moira Clay and Dr Joe Simonetta, for their work in co-ordinating the national program. In thanking state committees, Dr O'Loughlin advised that ASMR MRW® could not take place without the valuable contributions in

time, talent and energy of committee members. The financial support of the Department of Health and Aged Care was of great assistance.

The inaugural Australian Health and Medical Research Congress (AHMRC), Dr O'Loughlin reported, is to be held in November 2002. Dr Bronwyn Kingwell, has done a remarkable job in bringing the participants together. Societies are being canvassed about the possibility of conducting the AHMRC on a biannual basis rather than every four years as originally planned.

Dr O'Loughlin thanked Associate Professor Lyn Griffiths and the Committee for their work in organizing the ASMR NSC 2001.

ASMR will be working closely with NHMRC in collating and collecting evidence that the current investment in HMR is paying off in terms of health and economic outcomes. It must be remembered, Dr O'Loughlin said, that the next review of HMR funding will be seeking evidence of improved results.

Referring to the ABC Science Unit and concerns about funding and structural change, Dr O'Loughlin advised that ASMR has written to all politicians requesting support for the ABC in its essential role of communicating and analyzing scientific, technological and health-related issues and events. The Board will communicate these

recommendations to the incoming ABC Managing Director.

ASMR has made submissions by invitation to the following Reviews -

- Review of the NSW Cancer Council Act
- Inquiry into matters arising from the Post Mortem and Anatomical Examination Practices of the Institute of Forensic Medicine, NSW
- Child Health Research Institute, SA
- Women's & Children's Hospital, SA.

Dr O'Loughlin called on Dr Moira Clay to present the Treasurer's Report.

Item 4 -Treasurer's Report - Dr Moira Clay

Dr Clay referred to the Financial Statements contained within the Annual Report, advising of the \$55,254 consolidated net profit and net assets of \$327,826. Dr Clay further reported that ASN Events Pty Ltd, on behalf of the Society, have reported an accrued net income of \$34,778.

Item 5 - ASMR Research Fund -

Dr Moira Clay

Moving to the ASMR Research Fund Report, Dr Clay advised that the winner of the ASMR RF Award 2000, Raelene Lim had reported on her activities during the NSC and that the winner of the Award 2001, Patricia Mote, would be reporting at the NSC 2002. The Research Fund

showed a balance sheet figure of \$33,555 with the income for the year being \$1,910.

Dr Peter O'Loughlin moved that the Treasurer's Report and the ASMR Research Fund Report be accepted; seconded by A/Professor Andrew Sinclair.

Item 6 - Subcommittee Reports

a) Research Careers - Dr Catherine Coulter

Dr Catherine Coulter advised that the new NHMRC Research Fellowships policy is in place together with the Career Development Awards. The new initiatives include clinical and public health awards. Success rates are a little down this year and further details are included in the papers provided to the meeting by Professor Warwick Anderson. ASMR is developing a careers workshop template to facilitate ongoing training and advice in all states.

b) Membership - Dr Cassie James (Lawson)

Dr Peter O'Loughlin called on Dr Rohan Baker to present the Membership Report. Apologies from Dr Cassie James who left the meeting prior to the presentation of sub-committee reports. Dr Baker advised that there are currently 850 paid up members. He requested any member with subscriptions outstanding to pay their dues as soon as possible. There are two new affiliate members joining the existing 37 specialist societies and seven medical colleges which form the affiliate membership of ASMR; they are the Australian Society for Parasitology and the Western Australian Biomedical Research Institute. One new

Associate Member, the Sceleroderma Association of NSW.

c) Newsletter and

Communications - Associate Professor Andrew Sinclair
Associate Professor Andrew Sinclair advised that there had been three editions of the newsletter in 2001. He thanked Cath West and Lexy Harris for their efforts and also members who contributed articles. A/Professor Sinclair reported that the highlight of the year was the election issue which contained comment on policy by the three health spokespersons. There may be additional electronic versions next year. A/Professor Sinclair referred to the need for obtaining information on positive outcomes from increased funding to NHMRC and the initiation of a new Newsletter column entitled "Stars and Start-ups" which will highlight success stories.

d) ASMR Medical Research Week® - Dr Moira Clay

Dr Moira Clay reported on a successful ASMR Medical Research Week® and tour by the ASMR Medallist, Professor Alan Bernstein. The week is attracting more and more public attention; Dr Clay thanked all participants, state committees, Cath West and the Executive Office.

e) State Report - Dr Peter O'Loughlin

Dr O'Loughlin referred to the professional way in which the state committees are working with the Board of Directors and the Executive Office. Dr O'Loughlin thanked the committees for their sterling work.

f) National Scientific Conference 2001 - A/ Professor Lyn Griffiths

A/Professor Griffiths advised the meeting that she was pleased with all aspects of the Conference. Dr O'Loughlin

thanked Associate Professor Lyn Griffiths for her work in organizing the NSC.

g) National Scientific Conference 2002 - Dr Ricky Johnstone

Dr Ricky Johnstone advised that the NSC 2002 will be a component of the AHMRC. The theme for ASMR is "The molecular basis of human disease". Professor Joe Sambrook will be the AWT Edward Orator and Professor Ed Harlow is the Firkin Orator. Dr Johnstone invited all to attend.

h) Australian Health & Medical Research Congress - Dr Bronwyn Kingwell

Dr Kingwell advised that there are 25 different societies involved, eight are holding their AGM within the framework of the Congress and the rest conducting symposium. Dr Kingwell urged all to check out the AHMRC website and register interest; she also requested members spread the word about the Congress.

Item 7 - General Business -

Dr Peter O'Loughlin



Item 8 - Directors and Office Bearers 2002 -


Professor Peter Schofield
