Post-doctoral Awards

Dr lan Mackay - Newly identified viruses in acute respiratory tract infections of children. Viruses attack in packs: New ways of detection!!!

Dr Stuart Macgregor -A novel method for the analysis of pooled DNA samples on high density arrays. - Making genetic discovery cheap; finding the links between disease and genes is expensive but novel methods can be used to reduce the cost.

Dr Jos Malda - Wound healing: friend or foe? - Proof that oxygen therapy can be used to assist in wound healing.

Senior Post-doctoral Awards

Dr Dale Nyholt –Genome-wide significant Linkage to migrainous Headache - Twins provide clues to genes involved in causing migraine headaches

Dr Rachael Murray - SNARING Immunity - Understanding how the body's own immune system can cause diseases such as arthritis and psoriasis.

Dr Christopher Schmidt -Why do some cancers succumb to immune attack? Hide and seek by cancer cells – how some cancers evade the defenses of the body.

Postgraduate Student Awards

Alistair Forrest – Protein kinases and protein phosphatases: mining the kinome and phosphatome for nove disease genes - The online laboratory – use of computing tools by scientists to create online encyclopedias that will provide insights into causes of a large number of diseases such as cancer, Parkinson's disease, epilepsy.

Alberto Pinzon-Charry - Abnormalities in dendritic Cells in patients with cancer - Understanding how cancers "cripple" the body's immune system to prevent it fighting back.

Penny Jeffery – The roles of ghrelin and ghrelin variants in cancer - Investigation of a novel target that may aid in the treatment of breast and prostate cancers.
