"From Gene Technology to the Magic Bullet of Cancer Therapy: Is the promise coming true?" Eminent German Scientist, Professor Axel Ullrich in Brisbane today!

A champion of translational research and pioneer in cancer research and treatment, Professor Ullrich of the Max Planck Institute has taken his basic discoveries through to patient therapies including:

- Humulin (human Insulin for the treatment of diabetes), the first therapeutic agent to be developed through gene-based technology and the first biotechnology product ever.
- SUTENT/Sunitinib, for the treatment of Gastro Intestinal Stromal Tumors and Renal Cell Carcinoma
- **Herceptin**, the first gene-targeted treatment aimed at the cells causing breast cancer.

Professor Ullrich believes the creation of a gene database in the Singapore Onco Genome laboratory will provide a comprehensive picture of the genetics of cancer cell lines and tissues, enabling us to to exploit this knowledge of basic science and develop it into new cancer treatments.
