She is the author of seven books including *"The Private Life of the Brain"* and *"Tomorrow's People: How 21st Century Technology Is Changing the Way we Think and Feel"*, a broadcaster, television presenter and gifted science communicator!

Baroness Greenfield has said, "Academics talk about 'dumbing down' and think you can't grubby your hands in the real world. [However] it's more intellectually challenging to make salient, complex points sound simple." She believes we need a society where "to talk about science is as natural as talking about football'.
