16 young scientists, lead by Dr Renea Taylor visit, or return to, regional schools in Victoria, urging students to consider a career in medical research.

These dedicated scientists will talk about their own work and the contribution it can make to the health and well being of all Australians.

Speakers include:

Cathryn Hogarth, a PhD student at Monash Institue of Medical Research, former student of Wangaragtta High School and winner of the WISE Award. Cathryn's research centres on the machinery that drives the development of sperm in the testis.

Tve Dawood (Ballarat, Derrinallum, Geelong), a PhD student at the Baker Heart Research Institute and Monash University. Is it possible to die of a broken heart?

Tasha Czarny, a researcher with the Animal Gene Resource and Storage Centre. Part of Tasha's work is investigating the genetics and reproductive hormones of species including the Eastern Quoll and New Holland Mouse, both of which are in decline.

- **Heneu Tan, PhD** student, Howard Florey Institute. Working on epilepsy.
- Tu'Uhevaha Kaituu. PhD student. Prince Henry's Institute of Medical Research. Studying the underlying mechanisms of menstruation.
- Anne Fletcher, PhD student, Monash Immunology & Stem Cell Laboratories, looking at the immune system.

Dr Renea Taylor, co-ordinating the tour, is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at Monash Immunology and Stem Cell Laboratories, her work focuses on prostate cancer. Dr Taylor hopes to inspire country kids to make a similar journey to hers... from Sale to "the big smoke" to become a medical research scientist!
